

Call for applications for performance scholarships for the academic year 2021/22 according to §§ 57-61 Study Support Act 1992 (StudFG)

Merit scholarships serve to recognise outstanding academic achievements within the framework of a regular degree programme.

A merit scholarship may not be less than 750 euros and not exceed 1,500 euros.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Citizenship of an EEA member state or equal status for nationals (according to §4 StudFG)

You are considered equal to a national if you have:

- have a "Daueraufenthaltskarte EU" (EU permanent residence card)
- are Swiss and have been living in Austria for five years without interruption
- are stateless and
 - o have been subject to unlimited income tax liability in Austria together with one parent for at least five years prior to your first admission to the SFU and
 - o had the centre of their life interests here during this period of time
- Are a refugee
- are a British citizen

Regular student of SFU (at all campuses of Sigmund Freud University)

Compliance with the period of entitlement (§ 18 StudFG), taking into account any important reasons (§ 19 StudFG): The period of entitlement basically comprises the period of study intended for the degree programme plus one additional semester. When calculating the duration of entitlement, the duration of studies in the old study plan is added in the case of a change to a new study plan.

Outstanding academic achievement in a regular degree programme of at least 50 ECTS credits, examination date according to the academic year division from 1.9.2021 to 31.8.2022; this applies to all four fields of study

- Psychotherapy Science (PTW)
- Psychology (PSY)
- Human/Dental Medicine (MED)
- Law (JUS)

Grade point average

- Fields of study PTW, PSY and MED: maximum **1.5**
- Field of study JUS: maximum: **1.8** (If a scientific paper was submitted and/or a final examination was taken during the calculation period, both must have been assessed as "Very good" or "Good").

- Achievements that have been assessed as "Successfully completed" are always taken into account in the assessment and are assessed as "Very good" if the ECTS points specified in the curriculum have been achieved.

- The bachelor's/bachelor's thesis as well as the master's/master's thesis and the respective final examinations are included in the assessment.
- Doctoral studies in psychotherapy science: The doctoral studies must have been completed in the calculation period; the dissertation must have been assessed as "very good" and the final examination as "very good" or "good".

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Mon, 26 Sept to Fri, 14 Oct 2022.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- **PTS:** Personal submission with completed application form and copies of evidence of all relevant confirmations for the practical parts of the study programme during the period (PE/MPE, internship, reflection on internship, practice, reflection on practice, teaching analysis, individual or group supervision), at the PTW Study Service Centre, no proof of success.

- **PSY and JUS:** Personal submission with completed application form to the Study Service Centre of the faculty, no proof of success

- **MED:** Upload the completed application form in the Campus Management System ACADEMY5, via the Application Management.

Necessary proof of nationality equality and any important reasons for extending the entitlement period must also be attached.

ATTENTION:

Basically, in case of personal appearance, the guidelines of the government in force during the period of the application deadline apply with regard to the covid situation (such as submission with appointment, wearing an FFP2 mask, hand disinfection, distance regulation...) !

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:

All applicants will be informed of the approval or rejection by a message to their e-mail address. There is no legal entitlement to the award (§ 61 Abs 2 StudFG).

If too many students fulfil the minimum requirements in relation to the funds made available, only those students who can prove the best performance (grade point average lower than 1.5 or 1.8 for JUS) and have achieved significantly more than 50 ECTS points will be considered for the award. If there are too many eligible students, it is possible that students who already received a scholarship in the last academic year will not be considered in this year's distribution.
